T ake two caring devoted adults. Add warmth, kindness and understanding. Blend in five adorable happy children. Stir gently with sound teaching, skilled training and Biblical Christian standards and then allow it to grow in a well prepared environment where God is honoured and each individual is challenged to mature in the grace and knowledge of God. Season with respect and dignity.

Dana and Adam were married in 1998 and shortly after made their home in the CBS area. As young people, they had attended Church

from time to time but they never seemed to make it a priority.

Like most 'newly-weds', there were many options available to them. Dana had completed a Bachelor of Education Degree in primary education and Adam had earned a Bachelor of Commerce Degree, and then went on to become a Chartered Accountant.

However, with the arrival of their young family, Dana and Adam needed to make some important choices. First, they decided that Dana should become a stay at home mom, to provide the children with as much love and attention as possible. Then, after much soul-searching, they decided that their loving home could only be complete if it were a Christian home. They felt a need to find a nourishing home Church. About three years ago, they began attending The Salvation Army CBS Corps, where they were warmly welcomed. Since then they have attended faithfully and continue to grow in their faith.

Their next big decision was to home school their children. Their goal was to provide a home setting conducive to learning in every part of their lives. They felt strongly that the development of the mind, the body and the spirit is wrapped in one package and intimately connected.

Schedules for meals, bedtime and planned activities are most important. T.V. time is limited and programs monitored. As an alternative, the children are encouraged to express themselves in their well stocked arts and crafts room or to engage in some physical activity.

The Denny family also see the importance of caring for God's world. The children are actively involved in recycling, conserving water and energy. With Adam's assistance, they are designing and installing a solar heating panel for the bathroom .

Homeschooling involves a big commitment of time and energy but the benefits, they feel, far exceed the extra work involved. Their lives have been enriched as they observe their children implementing

Bible teaching in their daily activities. The children enjoy attending Sunday services and Ethan and Noah also participate in the Pioneer Program. Dana and Adam continue to learn on their spiritual journey and maintain that "*if we profess to be Christians, then we need to be different in every part of our living*". The CBS Corps congregation is so pleased to have the Dennys as part of our family. We commend the parents for the excellent training they are giving at home which is so evident in the way they conduct themselves and interact with others.

vation Army's Downtown Ministries.


