### Being a Christian—Easy or Not?



During the celebrations of the 102<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary of the CBS Corps in Long Pond, Gerry Mercer was one of the young people enrolled as a Senior Soldier.

Gerry has just begun his last year of studies at Holy Spirit High School in Manuels. On Sundays, you will see him smartly dressed in his Salvation Army uniform and with his Bible in hand, he joins in worship with the growing congregation.

Even though he is still a teenager, Gerry has faced some serious struggles and difficulties and will admit that being a Christian is not always easy, but it is very fulfilling. Through it all, he claims God's strength and power in his life.

Before his conversion, Gerry was involved in drinking and tried to separate himself from family and friends. He had reached a very low point

in his life; feeling that he just could not go on. He simply wanted to give up on life.

Around the same time his grandmother, Mrs. Olive Mercer invited him to come with her and her husband to attend a Sunday night church meeting, and he accepted. Each time he went thereafter, he felt a sense of peace and serenity, but wanted to remain unnoticed. However, some words from a Bible message really impacted his life. He realized that God didn't care about his background or his past mistakes, but he heard that God loved him just the way he was.

As Gerry listened, he was moved to go to the altar. As he knelt, he wept and prayed. He remembered the difficult times and the trials he had endured in his young life, but he gave it all to Jesus. At that very moment, he accepted Jesus as his personal Friend and Saviour.

From that moment, there was a desire in his heart to learn more about being a Christian and how he could serve God. He began to prove God's power and grace in his life. He testifies today to the fact that even during the tough times, God is with him. It's not easy being a Christian, as a teenage high school student, but it is well worth the effort.

He was particularly challenged by another Bible message delivered at a summer Open-Air Service. The speaker talked about his ministry to young people. Gerry felt God speaking to him again. He began to realize that he too could encourage other young people.

Just recently, Gerry attended a Men's Fellowship Camp at Camp Starrigan, near Musgravetown. Along with over 200 other men, Gerry enjoyed the Christian fellowship, the vibrant worship times, the personal testimonies of older men and especially the challenging messages from God's word. It proved to be a turning point in his life. Empowered by God's enabling grace, Gerry stood during one of the services and shared his own spiritual journey with these men.

He declared that he would give his whole life to God and he would be open and ready for God's direction. Gerry has been a great inspiration to all the congregation. In a recent Sunday evening service, Gerry was overjoyed to see two of his friends, whom he had brought to the meeting, kneel with him at the altar and claim salvation.

In his spare time, Gerry is a member of the Canadian Naval Reserves which is based at HMCS Cabot in St. John's.

Daily he thanks God for blessing his life and he very much appreciates the support and encouragement from his grandparents and members of the CBS Corps. He is determined to be a good soldier of Jesus Christ.



#### LET GOD'S ARMY GROW!

The town of Conception Bay South is one of the fastest growing communities in Newfoundland and Labrador. According to a 2006 statistic, the town boasts a population of almost 22,000 and experienced a growth rate of 11% between 2001 and 2006. Currently, CBS is the third largest population centre in our great Province.

The Salvation Army in CBS has been favorably affected by this expansion. In recent years, over 40 families have been welcomed to the Corps fellowship. In fact, according to a recent survey, CBS Corps ranked number 6, in the highest average attendance for Sunday morning worship in the whole Province. This has resulted in a 15% increase in personal financial giving.

During the past year, replacement windows on our Church property and extensive repairs to the parking lot have now been completed. Collapsible chairs have been purchased for the fellowship hall and very shortly, sanctuary chairs will also be replaced.

In striving to meet the varied needs of our growing congregation, Majors Wayne and Rosemary Green and the Corps Ministry Team seek to provide suitable programs for all ages. Women's Ministries, Men's Fellowship and Bible Studies have already commenced for another year. Children's Ministries continue on Sunday mornings and it is expected that over 60 young people will register for the successful Pioneer program. God's Army is growing. There is no age limit. Everyone is welcomed and encouraged to come and share. CBS Corps is pleased that so many of the newcomers are Soldiers (official members) and proudly wear their Salvation Army uniform.
