# A FAITHFUL FATHER



eorge Albert Guy and his wife Gloria became part of CBS Corps a couple of years ago. They quickly endeared themselves to the Corps family by their friendliness and willingness to help, whenever they were needed. They moved here from Arnold's Cove, George's hometown.

In 1973, George was commissioned as a bandsman there, which was the culmination of a lot of hard

work and determination. In the earlier days, he and a number of other beginners, met for practise, in the mornings before school started. This was difficult for George, who was out fishing at that time. However, he practised on his own and with help from his nephew, he succeeded. With young people leaving home for employment and education, there was the challenge to keep the band going. Again, George took it upon himself to train others, including his wife. His faithfulness was seen in the growth of the Corps Band. He also served as Young People's Sergeant Major for 18 years and as Quartermaster for 7 years.

Just recently, at CBS, Major Lorne Pritchett honored George for his 41 years of faithful service as a bandsman. (above) No doubt, his commitment and passion for service was a good example to his family, especially his son Clifford, who was taught to play by his father. Clifford himself was a bandsman, a graduate Corps Cadet, and later developed his musical skills with the piano, piano accordion, guitar and button accordion. In an expression of tribute to his father's influence, he recalls "One of the constants who kept everything together ...who saw the importance of keeping young people in the church, who was much more than just a believer in Christ but a 'doer'... was Dad".

Like his father, Clifford has a desire to learn. Following high school graduation, he received his Bachelor of Science Degree (Honors) from MUN and in 2008, he achieved his Doctorate in Medicine.

Today, he is a Staff Scientist and Director in the Imaging Department of Immunology at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee. He has participated in numerous research opportunities, including MUN, and has presented many excellent articles to an impressive number of Peer-Reviewed Journals. He has been recognized for his skillful training, his avid research and vibrant presentations and has been rewarded with a number of scholarships and awards.

# **CBS Corps Embraces the Great Commission**

The Salvation Army in Conception Bay South has taken The Great Commission to heart and is living out Matthew 28: 19-20 to a literal and practical means - "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations....."

In October 2011, under the direction of Adam Denny, the Corps decided that a great opportunity was available, through modern technology, to present the Gospel in a unique way. Sunday morning services were captured on video and uploaded to our website to be viewed by congregational members who were unable to attend.

Little did they realize how wide spread this ministry would become and how many people would be reached through this new technology.

At that time, The Salvation Army CBS Corps averaged 175 in Sunday morning attendance. With the videos, however, we were reaching another 200 all around the world.

In January of 2015, the Denny family transferred to St. John's, NL. Some changes were imminent. At the same time, Corps Officer, Major Lorne Pritchett felt the need to seek further ministry opportunities through social media. Since then a number of people have received training and now volunteer their time in our productions using our state of the art equipment. In April, he commissioned Maurice Collins as the new Information Technology Sergeant. Since then, this unique ministry has expanded far beyond our expectations.

With Maurice's skills and knowledge, a new Twitter and Facebook account was set up promoting the activities of the Corps. The videos for both Sunday morning and Sunday night services were uploaded and promoted through these accounts.

Maurice says "Using Social Media to promote your Corps is a great tool to reach people." This has proven to be very successful. The average number of people viewing the videos has grown from 200 per week to almost 1000.

We are now reaching people in 83 different countries around the world. God is blessing our efforts and is using this ministry to reach people from many different nationalities. During the last year over 48,000 individuals have played the videos.

Just recently, a new avenue of ministry has become available. The Corps had made all Sunday worship services live through the network. People now have the option of viewing them in actual time through the Corps website.

Maurice says "These are really exciting times in the history of our Corps. Not only is the Corps ministering to people inside its walls, but we are reaching people globally. Countries such as Israel, Brazil, Jamaica, China, Germany, Norway, Sweden, India, Portugal and Taiwan are hearing the Gospel Message."

The local congregation is now global with an average of almost 700 people per service and is growing on a weekly basis. We are hearing from people all over the world of how God is blessing them through the ministry of our Corps

It is our goal to reach as many as we can; to uplift the name of Jesus Christ and tell people what He can do in their lives if they surrender to Him.

There is a song that states "Little is much when God is in it" and we have proven that this is so true. We asked God to bless this ministry and He has done it. We are looking forward to hearing from many people who have accepted Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour

We need to use every avenue of ministry that is available to us to promote the Gospel. Isn't that what going into all the world means?
