A mbrose Payne was born in Harbor Round, a tiny community near La Scie in White Bay. Shortly after finishing high school, he completed an Industrial Cooking course at the College of the North Atlantic Trade School in Seal Cove, CBS. As a young man, he had no interest in attending church. He struggled with finding purpose and meaning for his life. He was consumed with trying to please others and to feel accepted.

Following a number of disappointing experiences in his life, he met Patsy, who became his wife in 2001. They moved to the CBS area about 6 years ago. Patsy had faithfully attended The Salvation Army in Gambo and Hare Bay for a number of years. It was a new experience for Ambrose. He remembers his first visit to the CBS Corps. Some Salvationist friends, who were visiting at the time, wanted to go to the Sunday night meeting, and he went along.

"FORGIVEN"

Ambrose fell in love with the Army and the people. At that meeting, he was presented with the gospel of Jesus Christ and knew he was under conviction. God continued to speak to him over the coming weeks as he continued to attend the services. Ambrose clearly remembers the Sunday in July, 2011. Following a passionate appeal by the Corps Officer, Major Lorne Pritchett, Ambrose knelt at the altar and invited Jesus into his heart. He describes his experience "There was a great sense of relief in knowing that I was forgiven and that God was on my side and wanted what was best for me."

With the help and guidance of his wife, his Corps family and especially God, Ambrose came to realize that being a Christian is not about just 'doing good'. He knows the truth of **Ephesians 2:8 "For it is by grace you have been saved...**"

A year later, in full Salvation Army uniform, Ambrose was enrolled as a senior soldier. In April, 2015, he was commissioned as the Corps Flag Sergeant, a position he carries out with pride and dignity. Ambrose testifies "God has given me fulfillment and purpose and joy. I am not perfect and I still mess up, but God loves me despite my flaws and imperfections. God has never left me. He shows Himself to me through His precious Word." His desire is to see others, especially his family come to know and accept God's plan of salvation. "It's the most important decision you can ever make," Ambrose declares.
