# Following Mother's Advice



G eorge Preston was born in Trinity, Bonavista Bay in 1950, and as a child, regularly attended the Anglican church.

In time, the family moved to Wesleyville, Gambo and Embree, and while there, he completed his high school education at Lewisporte. Following that time, he worked at the local fish plants at Marystown and Fortune.

Still trying to find his way in life, George and his uncle decided to head to Toronto. They left NL, and after arriving in North Sydney, with very little resources, they began to hitch-hike the rest of their journey. They sought help along the way with The Salvation Army, for accommodations and food for which they were very grateful. To this day, George has always held The Salvation Army in high esteem and always supports their ministries, especially the Christmas Kettle projects.

Things settled down in his new life in Toronto and he began to live the good life. In a short while, he became a competent truck driver. Eventually, he developed some harmful habits, drinking and gambling. He was not a happy person. His wife, Robina, whom he had married in 1971, continued to support him but they both realized they were going down a dangerous road. God was not in the picture at all.

Then George began to remember a conversation he once had with his mother in 1978, just before she passed away. She had always been a Christian and was concerned for his spiritual welfare. She regularly prayed for him and then she pleaded with him to make matters right with God, but at that time, he was not interested .

However, after years of battling with his struggles, George's life changed. He quit drinking and accepted a friend's invitation to attend The Salvation Army Corps at Glencairn, Ontario. Through the help and support of the Corps Officers, Majors Owen and Sharon Rowsell, George finally received the help he desperately needed. He realized the serious consequences of the life style he was living. He believed that he had hit rock bottom and realized he could not help himself. In October, 2009, after attending the Corps for a while, George and Robina knelt at the altar and committed their lives to Jesus Christ. This new life gave them meaning and purpose.

Once again, life was good and he sensed a wonderful freedom, without the dependence on his addictions. Around 2017 having spent almost 40 years in the trucking business, George and Robina decided to return to NL, and they settled in CBS. Family relatives, Ambrose and Patsy Payne were members of the CBS Corps and invited George and Robina to come along. They were warmly welcomed and they feel at home and enjoy the warm fellowship.

They faithfully attend Sunday services and Robina attends the Home League. George also enjoys the Men's Fellowship, when his working schedule makes it possible for him to attend.

They have been blessed with 2 sons, who live in Toronto and 2 granddaughters and 2 grandsons. George is so thankful that he finally took the advice of his mother and asked God to guide his life. His daily prayer today is that all of his family will be led into a personal relationship with God. He desires to set a good example as a father and a grandfather. His advice is to put God first in every part of your life.
